Executive Summary

The Prananath Autonomous College (hereafter, PNAC) came into existence on January 28, 1959. It was founded by a legendary philanthropist, Shri Prananath Patnaik. The then Union Minister of Education, Prof. Humayun Kabir laid the foundation stone of the college named "Khordha College." In November 1970, the College was rechristened Prananath College and later in 2006, as Prananath Autonomous College. The PNAC celebrated its golden jubilee year on 27th November 2010.

The Odisha State Higher Education Council (hereafter, OSHEC) performed an Academic Performance Audit (APA) of the PNAC over a period of two days starting on 22nd February 2022. The OSHEC took this initiative and the principal of the PNAC, Dr. Ranjita Sethi welcomed the intent of the Council. One of the objectives of the OSHEC is to conduct an Academic Performance Audit of all HEIs in Odisha under the administrative control of the Department of Higher Education, Government of Odisha.

The OSHEC reviewed the academic activities of various departments of PNAC for 2020-21 under four broad categories, (1) Student-related performance, (2) Teacher-centric performance, (3) Infrastructure, and (4) General activities that reflect academic growth.

Major highlight

- 1. PNAC was awarded Autonomous Status by the UGC in June 2006.
- PNAC received an 'A' grade accreditation status from the NAAC in 2006 and again on December 16, 2016.
- The PNAC was adjudged "College with Potential for Excellence" by the UGC, w.e.f., 24th August 2011.
- The distinctiveness of PNAC is reflected in Pujya Puja under the banner of which it
 offers different categories of awards and prizes annually.
- 5. Notable awards are (a) PRANANATH SANMAN which is presented to eminent persons and noted scholars for their outstanding contribution to the field of education and social reform; (b) PRANANATH SANGEET SAMMAN is presented to the eminent musicians, dramatists, and singers of the state; and (c) ANJARI DEVI AWARD is presented to distinguished scholars for their profound contribution to the field of literature (novel, short story, poetry, criticism, drama, and children's literature).


Academic Performance Audit

The audit team reviewed 19 departments/units at PNAC. In addition, the team also reviewed the activities of the central library, examination section, programs in self-financing mode, administrative office, and NCC/NSS. The team interacted with the Principal, Officers, IQAC coordinator, In-charge of the website, and In-charge of e-resources of the college.

A systematic review of the departments revealed a median of 0.46 as the Performance Index of PNAC on a scale regular to the of PNAC on a scale ranging between 0.0 and 1.0. Figure 1 depicts the summary of the evaluation. Four departments out of the 19 secured a Performance Index ≥ 0.60

Figure 1: API of departments as a function of deviation from the median API score of 0.46. The Audit Team identified the following areas wherein PNAC needs to be more watchful.

- 1. The affiliation search results in the SCOPUS database did not reveal the presence of the PNAC.
- 2. The digital presence of the researchers of PNAC on the pages of Publons powered by Web of Science and ORCID is absent.
- 3. The teachers of the college should be encouraged and oriented to publish research/review articles in globally reputed databases, like WoS, Scopus, and PubMed.
- Students should deliver at least 4 seminars each semester.
- PNAC should offer skilling courses for UG and PG students through its departments. The College can introduce online learning courses through SWAYAM to strengthen undergraduate education.
- 6. The IQAC should initiate Internal Audit and identify the best performing individual teacher, and departments every year and felicitate them in public events, such as on Foundation Day or Teachers' Day, etc.
- 7. In addition to Academic Audits, IQAC should undertake Green Audits, Energy Audits, and Gender Audits regularly.

- and goo-tagged pictures. PNAC should augment its digital presence through social media networks, namely

- 11. The SWOC analyses of the PNAC should be revised and rephrased
- 12. Adequate infrastructure support should be extended to each department every year
- 13. Consultancy Cell should be energized and attempts should be made to offer consultancy Cell should be energized and attempts should be made to offer consultancy to government, non-government organizations, businesses, trade, and industry.
- 14. All the laboratories need to be well-maintained and equipped with up-to-date
- 15. Adequate provisions for basic amenities, such as WiFi connectivity, washrooms, and drinking water for students, employees, and differently-abled individuals should be made
- Cleanliness and beautifications of the departments and the campus are desirable.
- 17. The frequency of parent-teacher and mentor-mentee/proctorial meetings should be increased.

Additional Suggestions

- This is high time PNAC should participate in India Rankings 2023.
- DPR should be prepared for opening PG programs in major subjects, like Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Botany, Zoology, Economics, Geography, English, etc.
- All self-financing programs should be regularized and attempts should be made to create faculty positions for these departments.
- The PNAC should draft and publish short-term and long-term IDPs.
- The PNAC should develop an R&D culture on the campus linked to intra-mural incentivization.

- 3. A list of publications of teachers should be published on the website. Each publication should carry its DOI number and a link to the respective journal's website.
- 4. The Research Policy and Procedures implemented by the DHE should be published on the website.
- 5. Individual faculty should have access to update their CV on the website.
- Scribers for phys. challenged students need to be reflected on the website.
- In a nutshell, the waterite should be NAAC-compliant.

- Details of the titles of books and the number of books should be published on the pages
 of the PNAC's website.
- Details of the book lost, books not returned, and a list of weeded-out books should also be reflected in the library pages on the website.
- The resources in the library should be digitized at a fast pace and the information should be shared with the INFLIBNET for inclusion in the IndCat project.
- 5. Details of faculty footfall in the library should be recorded continuously.
- There should be a repository for the academic publications of the teaching faculty. It should also include soft copies of all dissertations and theses.
- The library should have Smart TV, CC TV, and Wi-Fi connectivity.

Extramural Research Projects

- Most of the departments do not have sponsored research projects from national and international funding agencies.
- 2. At any given time, each department should have at least two ongoing research projects.
- 3. The faculty should have multidisciplinary collaborative projects.

Observations

A summary of the consolidated Academic Performance Index of 19 departments/units is presented below in the Table. The departments were assessed based on FOUR major criteria, namely (1) Student-related performance, (2) Teacher-centric performance, (3) Infrastructure, and (4) General activities that reflect academic growth. The median Performance Index score was found to be 0.46 for PNAC. Four out of 19 departments had a Performance Index ≥ 0.60.

General Advisory to all Departments

- 1. All the departments should revise and update their syllabi regularly.
- 2. Each student should make at least 4 seminar presentations each semester.
- Drop-out analysis should be made carefully. Someone taking TC for employment should not be considered a dropout. Similarly, someone taking TC for his/her admission into some other programs in a different HEI should not be considered a dropout.
- Guest teachers recruited for two consecutive semesters or a period of 9 months are to be considered in the category of 'regular teachers.'
- 5. All activities of the departments should be published on the pages of the HEI's website.
- Mentor-Mentee meetings should be carried out regularly. It could be given a space in
 the timetable of each department. The proceedings of such meetings should be
 published on the web pages of the college. It should not function as a grievanceredressal unit.
- 7. The departments scoring ZERO on any assessment criterion need to overcome such a
- The students should be encouraged, motivated, and groomed to participate in the NET/GATE examinations.
- All teaching faculty should get themselves registered on academic platforms, like Vidwan [https://vidwan.inflibnet.ac.in/].
- All teaching faculty and students should use e-Resources maximally provided to them through the EBSCO platform.
- 11. Students should be motivated to apply for fellowships.
- Patent, Consultancy, and Counselling are the areas where the contribution of the college can be more productive.

Department-specific Recommendations

Odia, Sanskrit, and English

- 1. All language departments should offer interdisciplinary courses either as skilling or add-on courses collaboratively
- The inclusion of cultural studies in the syllabi is desirable.
- Initiate collaborative research
- Publication of special lectures in the form of journal articles/website articles
- 5. Translate books published by Sahitya Akademi, India's National Academy of Letters into Odia.

Botany, and Zoology

- Offer consultancy in the areas of expertise.
- 2. Publish details about the consultancy cell on the college's website.
- 3. Augmentation of alumni engagement is essential.
- 4. Augment collaborative research activities.
- Each department should sign MoUs with peer institutions.
- 6. Maintain the record of Student's progression perfectly.
- SWOC analysis should be revised and rephrased.

Computer Science

- 1. This department should ensure that all teachers of the colleges are registered in Publons, Google Scholar, and ResearchGate platforms.
- The department should initiate a consultancy program.
- 3. The department could start publishing a journal/magazine. The ISSN should be procured for these publications.
- 4. The faculty should write collaborative and multidisciplinary projects.

Chemistry, Physics, and Mathematics

- SWAYAM and NPTEL courses should be introduced.
- 2. An adequate number of computers should be provided for the Chemistry, Physics, and Mathematics departments.
- 3. The mathematics department should get licensed software, like MATLAB, SPSS, etc.
- 4. Encourage guest faculty for writing reviews for publication.
- 5. Encourage faculty to publish in journals listed in Scopus and WoS.
- Participate in outreach activities.
- 7. Include Mentor-Mentee Interaction meetings as a component in the Time Table.

Economics

- 1. Publications should be uploaded on the pages of the College's website with DOI numbers and links.
- 2. Develop a few skills development courses and one value-added credit course with a 40-hour duration.
- 3. Intensify Mentor-Mentee activities.
